Careers Education & Guidance Policy 2018

Introduction

Our Careers Education and Guidance Policy at Derrymount School incorporates the aims of the school as well as recent initiatives in careers education in relation to the Gatsby Benchmarks.

The planned programme of study helps students to understand their interests, strengths and weaknesses in relation to the world of work and lifelong education therefore helping them to both identify their choice of career and their pathway towards it.

It incorporates planned activities that use the context of work to develop the knowledge, skills and understanding that are useful in a work setting, including learning through the experience of work, about work and working practices and an emphasis on learning the skills for work.

Students learn about different careers and opportunities for training, apprenticeships and volunteering and investigate further education options.
